LAST WILL & TESTAMENT OF R.C.D. BRAYAN DECEASED.  
GEORGIA ~~WILKES~~ COUNTY.

I, R. C. D. Bryan, being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and execute this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me.

I direct that all my just debts, including funeral expenses, be paid as promptly as possible after my death, and that my executor erect proper markers my own and my wife's graves, unless the same has been done.

## II.

I give and bequeath to my daughter, Emily Vaughn, my refrigerator, chest of silver, bed dresser, wash stand, desk in front room, figured rug on the floor, washstand in my bed room, piano, table, small hatrack, round mirror in front room, heather in my room, set of dishes in china cabinet and all my dishes, clock and afghan thrower.

## III.

I give and bequeath to my son, Robert Bryan, bed dresser, chifferobe, table, my chair floor lamp in my room, my watch and chain, the long mirror in the hall, mine, my father's and my wife Nelly's pictures with frames, the red rug in the hall, all the dining room furniture, desk in the hall and the eiderdown comfort.

All the remaining household and kitchen furniture not bequeathed in the proceeding items is to be divided equally between my son Robert Bryan and daughter Emily Vaughn.

## IV.

I will and bequeath to my son Robert Bryan, my undivided interest in the house and lot whereon I now reside in fee simple, the same located at Philomath Ga..

## V.

All the rest and remainder of my estate, real, and personal and mixed, of whatever kind and description and wherever the same is located, which I now own or of which I may die possessed, I will bequeath and devise in equal shares to my son, Robert Bryan and my daughter Emily Vaughn in fee simple.

## VI.

I hereby nominate and constitute as executor of this my last Will and testament my son, Robert Bryan, hereby relieving him from giving bond, for the discharge of his duties, as such, and directing that he serve without charging commission, for winding up my estate. I also relieve my executor from making returns, annual or otherwise, to any Court or Courts, or from having an inventory or appraisement made of my estate.

## VII.

In order that my estate may be handled as economically as possible I hereby give and grant to my executor the following powers;

(a) I authorize my said executor to dispose of, sell, convey, transfer, or assign any part or all of my property, real or personal, at public or private sale, as he may deem best, without requiring the order, of any court or courts and without the necessity of advertisement or other notice thereof.

(b) I authorize and empower my executor to make a division of my estate in kind, or in cash or partly in cash and partly in kind to be agreed on by the beneficiaries of this my Will, and if they are unable to agree on such values, then the value to be (over)

determined by a sale thereof, as before set out.
